September 19th, Meeting Review

KAWS Coordinator's Report

The meeting started at 10:00am at the Meade USDA Service Center. No one attended this meeting, thus the following minutes are compiled from the other chapters and new information that was going to be covered during this meeting.

Frazier Park Update- This project is making headway. The final plan and specifications for the project have been completed and sent to KDHE for approval. The City of Ulysses is awaiting the final KDHE construction approval to advertise for bids. They are also waiting to receive the final DWR permit. All other permits and clearances have been received to date. Looks like construction should start this winter/spring with the project underway throughout 2007.

Upper Ark WRAPS Review- Mike provided a brief run down of what is currently being done with the WRAPS, since the initial stakeholder tour. Three Upper Ark WRAPS leadership meetings are being held monthly in three different areas of the watershed. They are the first Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday of each month in Garden City, Dodge City and Larned respectively. The meetings are held at 1:00pm and locations vary. So far the leadership teams are addressing the list of priorities and highlighting items to construct a dynamic WRAPS document. Public meetings will be held once the leadership teams are finished and the document is in rough draft form. Playa Lake Videos – Mike gave a brief overview of the new video, *The Playas – Reflections of Life on the Plains*. The video gives specific information on playas, their biology, issues relating playa hydrology to the Ogallala Aquifer and conservation efforts. Mike has copies of this video available to those interested in conservation efforts including landowners, conservation specialists, and anyone else wanting to know about playas. Salt Cedar Control Grant – Mike announced that we still have funding, left over from the initial \$25,000 grant, to do Salt Cedar Control projects. KAWS has also received an additional grant of \$20,000 to fund projects as well. Most of this money is already allocated, but some should be left over for a few more projects. If you have any potential projects contact Mike for the forms. He can also assist you with their completion.

Salt Cedar Projects – To date we are working on the following projects:

1. **Traylor Wetland** – Removal of Salt Cedar from around the natural water inlet and outlet and around the perimeter of the wetland itself.
2. **One River Corridor** – The first basal treatment project contracted through KAWS. Their infestation is light to moderate along the Arkansas River. They are going to kill the salt cedar and evaluate if there are any benefits to wildlife by leaving the dead tree biomass standing.
3. **Arnold Project** – This project is in year two of treatment and is evaluating the effects of Salt Cedar on the groundwater table along with three treatment plots of cut/re-cut, cut/burn and cut/spray.
4. **Dunne Ranch** – This project is being completed by the Gardiner Ranch and is also in year two of treatment. They are cutting trees and using cut stump spraying. Biomass is piled up and burned.

GIS Mapping through DASC and KAWS – Mike gave a brief update on the progress that has been made on the mapping feature that will be added to the KAWS website soon. The address is:

This mapping tool will allow our website users access to several different overlays and themes to create specialized maps that were once only available to those who had ArcView.

Project Update - Mike discussed the project funding for the SW portion of KS. To date only one project was submitted by the Cimarron River Chapter, five by the Buffalo Wallow Chapter and two by the Mid-Plains Chapter. There are remaining project dollars for the MPC and CRC, which both elected to make their left over money available to the BWC since they have allocated all of their project dollars.

Projects for the CRC include:

1. Frazier Park Wastewater wetlands and lake renovation – In Progress

Mike also talked about the new KAWS contracting system. However with the low number of projects to date, Mike is handling all of the contracts for his chapters to expedite the process. A majority of the projects are currently under contract and the rest will follow soon.
