This project was submitted to the Flint Hills Chapter of the Kansas Alliance for Wetlands and Streams (KAWS) and is located along the Cottonwood River in Chase County. This project was funded in part by an EPA Region 7 Wetland Program and Development Grant that was awarded to the Kansas State Conservation Commission (SCC). KAWS assisted the SCC in completing the grant. KAWS contracted with the Watershed Institute, Inc. (TWI) to conduct fish and macroinvertebrate sampling at a streambank stabilization project on the Cottonwood River. Located on the north edge of Cottonwood Falls, Kansas. The Project involved stabilization of approximately 600 feet of riverbank between the current and old U.S. Highway 177 bridges. Stabilization consisted of three rock vanes along the left descending bank and one along the right bank. Additionally, TWI completed monitoring tasks required under the project's Quality Assurance Project Plan.
